I will also be hosting an action event once a month, so you can get involved with our newly formed Senior Mobilization Squad and keep the older adult population well represented! After we will complete a Senior Mobilization Squad action; writing postcards to our representatives telling them to fight the proposed budget. The 2018 Budget Proposal:

Over the next decade this budget calls for slashing more than \$800 billion from Medicaid. It will also slice \$192 billion from nutritional assistance and \$272 billion from other welfare programs. The plan would cut more than \$72 billion from the disability benefits upon which millions of Americans rely, stripping away critical protections and slashing vital programs that ensure basic living standards for the 1 in 5 Americans with disabilities.

American Health Care Act:

If the American Health Care Act proposed by the House of Representatives becomes law, older adults could end up paying up to 5 times more than younger generations for their health insurance. In addition, older adults who are close to or below the poverty line will lose public-coverage guarantees. They will be forced to choose between paying up to half of their yearly income for coverage or going without coverage.

SB-219:

On May 16th, I traveled with other members of the Center's policy team to Sacramento to lobby for the passing of this bill, which is an LGBT Long Term Care Facility Bill of Rights. The bill continues to move through the Assembly and is awaiting referral to a committee there.
